



Why study for a degree at university?



- In depth study
- Some jobs require a degree

HE qualification gives you an advantage

- Potential to earn more over your career
- Develop subject knowledge and transferable skills





Traditional degrees



Over 43,000 courses

Over 300 institutions

Minimum course length is 3 years

 Career path not always tied to the subject studied

Loans available to cover finance

Degree apprenticeships - Levels of apprenticeships

Level	Type Equivalent		
2	Intermediate	5 x GCSE passes	
3	Advanced	A level passes	
4	Higher	HE certificate	
5	Higher	HE diploma	
6	Higher or Degree	Bachelors	
7	Higher or Degree	Masters	

Needs to be a level 6 to be a degree apprenticeship



Higher and Degree apprenticeships

- Full time work alongside study
- Can take 1 − 6 years to complete (depending on level)
- Employer pays course fees. Apprentice paid at least national minimum wage - £3.50 p/h
- Usually subject/sector specific

Why would a student choose one or the other?

Degree apprenticeships	Traditional degrees
Must be committed to study and work	Often less contact hours, more free time
Employee benefits, including a salary and pension whilst studying a degree	More varied opportunities - travel abroad, societies, volunteering
Apply knowledge in chosen sector	In depth subject knowledge
Employment opportunities within the company	Students can keep career options open
Far less of them (but more specific), more competitive	Lots of choice available



Employment Explained



Employment and Employment with training

- Not all professions require you to go to university to gain qualifications
- Some employers offer NVQ's and similar qualifications while you work
- Opportunity to be earning a salary at 18
- Research 'School leavers programmes'
 (e.g. <u>www.allaboutschoolleavers.co.uk</u>)





Employment and Employment with training

Examples include:

- Accountancy Firm PWC's 'Head Start' programme
 - offers school or college leaver jobs with the opportunity to gain a professional qualification in business

- Apprentice/trainee opportunities at lower than level 6
 - Often less study commitment, more sectors / companies available








Taking a Gap Year



Taking a gap year

- Often viewed positively by employers and universities
- Consider paid and voluntary work experience
- Lots of options to develop skills
- Research thoroughly (consider costs)
- Use deferral process if applying for university





Get some experience

- Chance to experience a profession will you enjoy the profession / role?
- Opportunity to build transferable skills
- Gives you content for personal statement (sometimes essential for course) or job application
- Gain contacts with potential future employers
